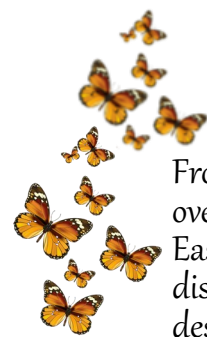


What's Happening at St. Paul's ...



Butterflies for the Garden

From Easter Sunday to Pentecost we celebrate Jesus' triumph over death, his resurrection, and promise of eternal life. The Easter season culminates with the feast of Pentecost in which disciples are imbued with the power of the Holy Spirit as it descends from above in the form of flames. There are many symbols associated with Easter but one of the oldest and most representative of Christ's journey is that of the butterfly. Today after the 10:30 service we will hand out boxes of butterflies to be released in the courtyard. It will be a representation and culmination of two principal feast days in the church- Easter-the resurrection and Pentecost-the flame of the Spirit. The boxes contain Painted Lady butterflies which are orange in color and might look a little like flames hovering in the air. They will be released next to the butterfly garden that was lovingly donated by Kathy Sheridan in honor of her mother Doris Tierney. Sincerely, *Elizabeth Longua*

Pentecost Banner

Pentecost is one of the seven principal feast days in the Episcopal Church. It celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit and the filling of the disciples with its power. Pentecost is most often represented by fire and the dove symbolizes the Holy Spirit. The Children have made flames each representing their share in the Holy Spirit and the sacred.

Baptism Banner

Baptism is a sacrament, in it we are sealed as Christ's own forever. We use water in baptism-symbolizing life. The paschal candle points to our connection to Jesus-the light of the world. The scallop shell represents water but also is a symbol of Christianity, the shell is ever expanding outwards. Our Children have decorated water droplets in every shade to represent their individual baptismal covenant. The droplets point to the first covenant of the rainbow and God's promise to Noah. They also point to the inclusive nature of Christianity-we are all God's children and all are welcome to receive his sacraments and gifts.
