Community Garden & Chester County Food Bank

Our Community Garden Committee harvested 29 more pounds of organic vegetables and herbs in the past two weeks, elevating our total donation for this growing season to 575 lbs. of healthy and nutritious food. This is an important St. Paul's Outreach Program, because all donations to the Chester County Foodbank are used to help feed our Chester County neighbors who have food insecurity.

The cooler weather has allowed our fall plants to begin to grow. FYI for all garden bed renters, we will not be shutting off the water to the garden until the end of October to allow these fall plants to mature fully.

The cooler weather has also slowed our tomatoes from ripening. If you are looking for a way to use your green tomatoes, you may want to try the old-fashioned Southern recipe below.

Fried Green Tomatoes (4 servings)

Ingredients:

- 4 large green tomatoes
- 2 large eggs, ½ cup breadcrumbs
- 1/2 cup milk, 2 teaspoons coarse kosher salt
- 1 cup all-purpose flour, 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- ½ cup cornmeal, 1 quart vegetable oil for frying

Directions

- Slice tomatoes 1/2-inch thick. Discard the ends.
- 2. Whisk eggs and milk together in a medium-sized bowl. Scoop flour onto a plate.
- 3. On another plate, mix cornmeal, breadcrumbs, salt, and pepper.
- 4. Dip tomatoes into flour to coat. Then, dip tomatoes into milk and egg mixture; dredge in breadcrumbs to completely coat and cook:

FIRST READING; A READING FROM Jeremiah 32:1 -3A, 6-15

In our Hebrew scripture lesson Jeremiah, confined in King Zedekiah's palace in Jerusalem for prophesying King Zedekiah's capture by the Chaldeans and the fall of Jerusalem, engages in a prophetic action. He purchases family land from his cousin and, as a public proceeding, Jeremiah gives his secretary Baruch the task of sealing and securing the deed. All of this is to indicate that, unlike the present time of calamity, the days will once more come when commerce and the buying and selling of property are possible. The state of siege will end.

The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD in the tenth year of King Zedekiah of Judah, which was the eighteenth year of Nebuchadrezzar. At that time the army of the king of Babylon was besieging Jerusalem, and the prophet Jeremiah was confined in the court of the guard that was in the palace of the king of Judah, where King Zedekiah of Judah had confined him.

Jeremiah said, The word of the LORD came to me: Hanamel son of your uncle Shallum is going to come to you and say, "Buy my field that is at Anathoth, for the right of redemption by purchase is yours." Then my cousin Hanamel came to me in the court of the guard, in accordance with the word of the LORD, and said to me, "Buy my field that is at Anathoth in the land of Benjamin, for the right of possession and redemption is yours; buy it for yourself." Then I knew that this was the word of the LORD.

And I bought the field at Anathoth from my cousin Hanamel, and weighed out the money to him, seventeen shekels of silver.



SECOND READING: A READING from 1 Timothy 6: 6-19

In this lesson, Paul exhorts Timothy to be strong with virtues in the race of faith, waiting for the appearance of the Lord Jesus. He warns against the love of money and instructs the rich to be generous and to store up the treasure of true life. Timothy was one of Paul's trusted associates. Paul refers to his noble confession of faith and now charges Timothy, in the presence of God and of Jesus, who made his testimony before Pontius Pilate, to keep the commandment with purity. Jesus will appear at the time appointed by the great Ruler and Lord, the immortal God, whom no mortal can ever see.

There is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time— he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen.

As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.
